REFUGEES AND MIGRANTS ARE NOT THE SAME THING!!!!

Migrants leave to improve their casual life (work, culture, or even because they prefer living there) whilst refugees leave their country because of war, natural disasters, disease, or starvation. There are also Internally displaced people and asylum seekers. Asylum seekers are people who flee from their country to avoid persecution. Internally displaced people are like refugees, but they don't cross any borders.



Refugees can come from many different countries and this is partially how cultures are formed. If they can, a refugee would go to the nearest country possible. Though sometimes their journey is long and hard. If someone has to leave their country, but doesn't cross any borders, then they are called Internally displaced. It is important that we respect their differences. Even if they are allowed in the country, it might still be very different from home E.G they might speak a different language, eat a different food or have a different culture.



If a country does not allow someone to enter then they might be sent back to their country or stay in a refugee camp. If the country does allow them to enter then they might have to fill in long documents and forms to prove who they are. Once being allowed into the country, a refugee is only given £5.66p a day to live off. Do you think this is enough money?
