## Plurals: adding -es

Watch out there's a new rule for plurals: Words that end in a shushing or hissing sound end in an -es when there is more than one!

Read the words and then say what they are when there are more than one of those things.

What do you notice?

1 fox  → 3 foxes   

1 brush  → 2 brushes  

In these words, you add an -es to the end of them when there is more than one.
